# Prayer Walking

Identify the neighborhood.

What area can you realistically pray for in the time you've allotted?

Map the route, set the date time and place.

Invite people to join you.

Prayer walking is a great introduction to the community

It is also wonderful for people who have preconceived ideas about what is going on

Communicate: You may want to let partners in the area know what you are doing.

Go in teams.

Pray specifically. Offer petitions and praise for the way God is moving in your community.

When you meet people who ask you what you are doing, be prepared with an answer.

Use this as an opportunity to be a blessing in your neighborhood

Ask if there is anything that you can pray for them...and pray, right then.
